

Round-Off Get a Grip Version 2 Templates

Want to create perfect rounded corners for all of your quilting, sewing and crafting projects? The Round-Off Get a Grip Templates give you 12 different radius options to round off corners easily, accurately and consistently. After you've rounded off one project, you won't want to stop!

The 'Get-a-Grip' material 'grabs' your fabric as you cut so you'll cut more accurately!

Small
Top Left – 1.0"
Top Right – 2.5"
Bottom Left – 2.0"
Bottom Right – 1.5"

Medium
Top Left – 2.25"
Top Right – 3.75"
Bottom Left – 3.25"
Bottom Right – 2.75"

Large
Top Left – 4.0"
Top Right – 5.5"
Bottom Left – 5.0"
Bottom Right – 4.5"

I originally had 3 templates that I now call "Version 1". They work very much like the latest version of Round Offs although they look different. They are individual templates and not 'nested'. Additionally, there are no radius markings on each rounded corner. If you have Version 1, feel free to mark the radiuses listed above on the templates with a metallic Sharpy.

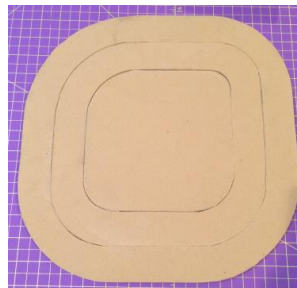

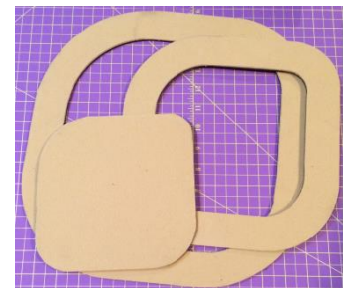
Front Side Nested

Round Off Template Cutting Directions

Round off those corners perfectly, easily... & consistently!!

Be sure to watch my videos for cutting with the Round Off Templates.

	<p>Practice makes Perfect! Grab scrap fabric and practice so you're comfortable with the templates.</p> <p>Square off your project first: Use a straight edge ruler to square off all sides of your project. You can use any ruler but I love Martelli's No Slip Strip Ruler! Videos can be found on my website.</p>
	<p>Choose your Template; Choose your Radius:</p> <p>There are 12 radiuses available; 4 on each Round-Off. Larger projects work best with a larger radius; smaller projects are better with a smaller radius.</p> <p>Experiment with different radiuses to see what you like! Choose which radius you want to use for your project.</p>
	<p>New Feature!</p> <p>Note the hash marks before and after the radius number. These are the Beginning and Ending Radius Lines. They tell you where the radius starts and stops. But they also allow you to create perfect circles! Fold a piece of fabric in half vertically, then fold that in half horizontally (in quarters), line up the folds with the lines, and you'll have a circle!</p>
	<p>Cutting with the Template:</p> <p>Line up the straight edges of the Round Off with the straight edges of your fabric.</p> <p>With your non-cutting hand pressing lightly on the template, move the fabric and template so that your rotary cutter can cut from your shoulder rather than in the middle of your chest. (Watch video.)</p> <p>Place cutter at the Beginning Radius Line and cut, following the edge of the template. Continue to cut, following the edge of the template, stopping at the Ending Radius Line.</p> <p>Tip: Keep cutter straight up; don't tilt to the side. 'Hug' the template as you cut.</p>
	<p>Next Corner:</p> <p>Using the same radius as the 1st cut, reposition the fabric so that it is in the same position as previous cut.</p> <p>Starting at the Beginning Radius line, cut with your rotary cutter - 'hugging' the template as you cut. Continue to cut, following the edge of the template, stopping at the Ending Radius Line. Continue this process for each corner to be rounded.</p>
	<p>Finished – Perfect, Consistent, Rounded Corners!</p> <p>Now you've got perfect rounded corners for all of your quilting, sewing and crafting projects!</p> <p>NOTE: If you have a larger piece of fabric, you won't be able to move both the template and the fabric as you cut as seen in the video. You can use the template as a traditional template and simply place your hand on top of the template and cut around. Reposition template for each additional cut, remembering to square off sides before cutting the curve.</p>
	<p>If you don't have access to a mat and rotary cutter, place template on top of your fabric, and holding both fabric and template with one hand, cut along the edge with a pair of scissors!</p> <p>Or, if you like, use the template as a guide and trace the edge with a marking tool. Remove the template then cut with a rotary cutter or scissors.</p>

Care & Handling of Template:

- The Get a Grip material must be kept free of accumulation of dirt, thread, etc.
- Store template with Get a Grip face up or in accompanying bag. Get a Grip will stick to painted surfaces.
- If Get a Grip material gets dirty, clean with light amount of soap & water, hand sanitizer, or window cleaner.
- My favorite cleaning method is to lightly press the area with a cheap piece of packing tape.



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
